

SUMMARY OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT : LOCAL PROGRAM OPERATOR (LPO) TANK SYSTEM INSPECTION AND PLAN REVIEW

Who am I?

My name is Michael Robert Dailey Jr. - I go by 'Robbie' (owner/operator of Wisconsin Inspections LLC). I am a certified tank inspector for the State of Wisconsin and a "Local Program Operator" or "LPO".

What is a "Local Program Operator"?

"Local Program Operator" or "LPO" means an entity, either public or private, under contract with the department to enforce the provisions of ATCP 93 and provide tank system plan review and inspection services in a specific region of the state.

What is the Memorandum of Agreement ?

The memorandum of agreement is in effect the municipality's authorization to the State that I can conduct the State-contracted work within the boundaries of the municipality. In order to conduct tank inspections in your municipality, the Department (DATCP) requires that I have written approval from the chief elected municipal official.

What experience do I have?

I have been in the compliance arena for over 5 years and have been a certified tank inspector for the State of Wisconsin since January of 2017. As a State of Wisconsin Petroleum Inspector, I have conducted tank inspections and enforcement for many municipalities including but not limited to:

- Madison
- Sun Prairie
- Stoughton
- McFarland
- Fitchburg
- Monona

What are the benefits for the municipality?

- There is no cost for this service. Inspection service fees are set and paid by the State of Wisconsin.
- Increases safety and environmental protection. LPO's are contractually obligated to conduct inspection on an annual basis. State inspectors are currently on a 2-year and 3-year deadline for underground and aboveground tanks, respectively.

- Transparency. Wisconsin Inspections LLC provides its municipalities with compliance records/data for tank systems within the municipality (upon request).

What are the benefits for the State?

- Reduces inspection burden on State. There are currently 33 state inspectors responsible for inspecting over 17,000 tanks as well as all Weights & Measures work for the State.
- Greater compliance to ATCP 93. With more inspectors, more compliance can be achieved.
- Cost effective. The LPO program saves tax-payer money.
