

# 2024 BRUSH PICK-UP SCHEDULE

Brush collection will occur monthly starting in April and continuing through November (weather permitting).

April 1<sup>st</sup>  
May 6<sup>th</sup>  
June 3<sup>rd</sup>  
July 1<sup>st</sup>  
August 5<sup>th</sup>  
September 2<sup>nd</sup>  
October 7<sup>th</sup>  
November 4<sup>th</sup>



**2025 Christmas tree pick-up will be the week of January 6, 2025**



**Brush must be at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on Monday of collection week to ensure pickup.**

In order to maintain efficient use of staff time, Public Works crews will be working through the Village once and not returning for brush that was not placed in time.

#### Please note the following:

- Brush collection is for brush trimmed by the homeowner only. Brush generated by a private contractor is to be disposed of by the contractor.
- While many Village residences abut public property, residents are not permitted to clear brush from public waterways, public natural spaces, parks or any Village-owned property.
- **NO** compost, root balls, barrels, lumber, furniture, bags or boxes of brush, or materials containing metal will be collected.
- All Christmas trees must be free of all items (stands, bags, tinsel, lights, ornaments, etc.) or they will not be collected.
- Large limbs are not to exceed 8 inches in diameter.
- Brush is to be stacked. If it is not stacked, it will not be collected.

## **BRUSH & COMPOST DROP OFF**



The drop-off site now accepts both **brush and compost** and is **open year-round**. The site is located at the former Public Works Building at 225 Bonnie Road. Brush must be smaller than 8" in diameter, and cannot include stumps, root balls or dirt. Compost materials accepted include leaves, grass clippings, pine needles/cones and garden/flower bed plants.
